

OPEN SHOW RULES & GUIDELINES

1. Open Show exhibitors agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of the Mifflin County Youth Fair.
2. One entry per class per exhibitor.
3. All exhibits will register either by mail or in person. Send entry forms to MCYF Open Show, P.O. Box 208 Reedsville, PA 17084 no later than July 22. At fair registration hours are Sunday 5-7 PM; Monday 11:30 AM-1:30 PM, 2-5 PM, and 8-9 PM. No registration during opening ceremonies. Please pre-register ALL baked goods. Pre-registered perishable items may be brought to the Green Building on Tuesday morning from 8:00-8:30 AM. All baked Goods MUST be in a disposable container and covered with plastic wrap prior to registration/delivery; failure to do so will result in disqualification. All baked goods will be auctioned Tuesday evening of the Fair at 6:00 PM/
4. No exhibits will be released until Sunday afternoon (2:00-4:00 PM) with signature. Exhibits not picked up on Sunday may be picked up on Monday after fair, as long as the Green Building is open.
5. All entries must be completed or grown within the 12 months between fairs by the exhibitor. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to select the most appropriate class for their entry.
6. Superintendents reserve the right to bar from competition any entry of decidedly inferior quality and those not possessing sufficient merit to warrant recognition.
7. ALL JUDGES DECISIONS WILL BE FINAL! Premiums shall be given for meritorious exhibits. In case there is no competition in a class, the judges may give the award if the exhibit is worthy to receive. The decision of the judge will be final.
8. Reasonable care will be taken to protect all exhibits on display from damage, but the Fair is not held responsible for accidents, loss, damage, theft, or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss.
9. Any exhibitor may be required to prove ability to reproduce entry in any department in the presence of a qualified person.
10. Premiums as listed may be given for meritorious exhibits. BEST OF SHOW for each department will be paid if sponsored.
11. PREMIUM CHECKS WILL BE MAILED; however, to receive your premium, you MUST follow check out procedure. This means NO entries will be removed from the Green Building before Sunday (2-4 PM) or Monday (8-9 AM). No exceptions! Early removal of entries forfeits premiums! Items not picked up by Monday become fair property. Please cash premium checks promptly.

DEPARTMENT 2: DAIRY

1. Limit to 8 animals for farm, firm, or family in Open Show division.
2. ENTRIES: Any registered Dairy Cattle owned by a Mifflin County resident is eligible. Use the blank entry included, and then return to the Extension Office. Additional entry forms are also available from the Extension Office or on the Fair web site at www.mcyouthfair.com. All 4-H and FFA members are required to fill out entry forms. There is NO ENTRY FEE. Entry deadline is Friday, July 22. Failure to return the registration forms by the deadline will result in you not being able to show!

3. ARRIVAL TIME: All non-milking open animals must be checked into the Youth Park by 8:00 PM on Monday. All spaces at the Youth Park will be assigned based on entries.
4. SHOW TIME: Tuesday, August 9, at 10:00 AM
5. Open Dairy Projects are released at the conclusion of the Open Show.
6. Please see the Dairy rules for specific health requirements and entry for show.
7. OPEN SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES (must be a Mifflin County resident):
Pee Wee: 8 and under (will show on Thursday Aug 11 at 7 PM)
Adult Showmanship: \$10 entry fee. Pay out for top 3 (will show on Tuesday, Aug 9 at 10 AM)

DEPARTMENT 4: WOOL

Section 1: Wool CLASS:

1. Wool exhibited must be produced by the exhibitor who must have owned the sheep from which the fleece was shorn.
2. Full Fleece bund led and tied (No plastic bags)
3. Exhibitors are open to: Purebred flocks, commercial flocks, and natural color flocks.

Section 2: Skeins CLASS:

1. Skeins must be a minimum of 20 yards, must be tied in 4 places and must be accompanied by a sample of the unspun fleece.
2. A 3"x5" card must accompany the skein Stated: fleece type, breed, # of ply, fiber preparation
3. Optional: exhibitor may attach a 4x4" project sample that may be knitted, woven, crocheted or other for display and for touching by the public after judging.

- Exhibit will consist of one dozen eggs in a standard carton.
- An official egg scale will be used at registration.
- Any cracks, discolorations not part of the shell, abnormalities, etc will disqualify the entry.
- Classes: Pee Wee 14-15 oz dozen Small 16-18 oz dozen Medium 19-21 oz dozen

- All entries limited to Mifflin County 4-H and FFA club members.
- 4-H and FFA members may compete in the Open classes only if the member is competing in the 4-H/FFA department.
- Refer to 4-H and FFA guidelines in the FRONT OF THIS BOOK.

All entries to the Open Show must be completed within the same calendar year

DEPARTMENT 49: YOUTH

OPEN

1. This department has been set up for youth WHO ARE NOT 4-H and FFA members to provide youth under the age of 19 the opportunity to participate at the fairs.
2. Entries are limited to one per exhibitor in EACH CLASS.
3. All entries must be grown or made during the current fair year by the exhibitor.
4. Please see the Open Show guidelines for specific qualifications.
5. All entries will be dated with the current year by fair personnel.
6. Decorated Cake: one or two layer round cake or 9x13. Judged only on decoration. Bring on a secure covered base.

SECTION 2—HAY

1. Long hay only. An exhibit shall consist of a bale section at least 8 inches thick, not larger than 14x18".
2. All entries must be raised and owned by the exhibitor.

DEPARTMENT 13: VEGETABLES

1. In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose such specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest—select medium size specimens. Avoid mixing varieties.
2. BRING YOUR OWN PAPER PLATE OR PLATES TO DISPLAY YOUR ENTRIES.
3. The following factors are generally used by an expert vegetable judge:
 - A. Trueness to variety type. Pick specimens from 1 variety.
 - B. Uniformity in shape, size, and color.
 - C. Pick a perfect specimen, then select others similar to it. Never mix specimens of varying maturities.
 - D. Protect from dirt, disease, infection, and mechanical damage. Pick specimens that are perfect and show no blemishes.
 - E. Condition and maturity: be sure that exhibits are of high quality.
 - F. Vegetables can be lightly washed. Remove soil using a soft cloth or brush.
 - G. Large fruited tomatoes should have stems removed. Small fruited tomatoes must have stems on cluster.
 - H. Carrots, beats, etc should have tops removed from vegetables leaving about 2” of stem.
 - I. Potatoes should not be washed. Dirt clumps may be brushed off, do not remove the skin
4. Read premium material carefully, following all rules and regulations. If an entry calls for 5 specimens, be sure to exhibit that number. Your exhibit will be disqualified for having a number of specimens other than what is specified.
5. Only classes listed may be entered.
6. Read the general rules for additional information.
7. **All entries to the Open Show must be completed within the same calendar year.**

2. All entries must be raised and owned by the exhibitor.
3. The following score is to be used as the basis for judging exhibits:

4. Each exhibitor must designate the particular premium for which he is competing in special classes and see that the packages are properly tagged. Single specimens may not be considered or shown in variety classes.
5. Premiums will be awarded only when the exhibit complies with the standard, is meritorious, and is properly named.

DEPARTMENT 15: HOME PRODUCED PRODUCTS

1. All products must be made by the exhibitor. Premiums will not be paid for commercial products.
2. All baked goods must be on disposable plates and covered with plastic wrap, or disqualified.
3. Complete baked goods must be brought to the fair either Monday or Tuesday morning by 8 AM. After judging, the Fair may display only a portion of the product for the week. The remainder will be auctioned on Tuesday evening at 6 PM.
4. All Entries must be completed within the current calendar year.

SECTION 1—BAKED PRODUCTS

1. To be judged on flavor, lightness, general appearance and crumb.
2. Pies to be judged on overall appearance, crust, color, flavor texture, doneness, and filling consistency. Pans will not be returned. Pies must be in disposable pans and must be 8 inches in diameter.
3. Decorated cakes may either be a two layer round cake or a 9x13 cake. Displayed on a sturdy covered base. If using a Styrofoam base, it must be securely fastened to the base. Judging will be on decoration.

SECTION 4—HONEY SPREADS, JAMS, JELLIES, MARMALADES, PRESERVES

1. One standard jelly glass with removable lid. Sealed with lid or paraffin. Judged on appearance, flavor, consistency, and neatness of package.
